- B. There are many names for Christians: brothers, disciples, those who follow the way and saints. (Acts 9)
- C. Paul addresses Christians at Ephesus as saints.
- D. Saints are living people.
- E. A saint is one who is different because God has set him apart.
- F. Paul gives us characteristics of a saint.
- II. A saint is one who is different because he has trusted in God's Son.
 - A. Saints believe in God's Son.
 - B. Our faith is specific faith in a specific person. We believe in the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - 1. Christ is Jesus prophetic title.
 - 2. Jesus is his name meaning savior.
 - 3. Lord is Jesus' title meaning God.
 - C. Paul called himself a saint.
 - D. A saint is one who has a spiritual address: in Christ Jesus.
 - E. Paul uses the phrase "in Christ" to talk about a new spiritual relationship.
- III. A saint is one who has experienced God's grace.
 - A. Grace is God's favor to the undeserving without expectation of return.
 - B. We are rich because of God's grace.
 - C. We have everything we ever need if we have experienced God's grace.
- IV. A saint has received God's peace.
 - A. Every human being is at war with God, with others and with himself.
 - B. Christ comes to give us peace. Jesus is our peace. (Ephesians 2:14; 6)
 - C. Jesus is sharing peace through us.

- D. When we have peace with God, we have nothing else to fear.
- V. A saint is one who has entered God's family.
 - A. This is to say that we share God's nature.
 - B. Because of this we share a special fellowship with other believers.
