- IV. We measure whether we are following after Jesus by asking whether our investments are knowing Jesus more, trusting Jesus more and producing more fruit. (Isaiah 43:10; 2 Peter 1:2; Hebrews 11:6; Galatians 5:22-23; John 15:8)
- V. What we can do.
  - A. Keep the objective in mind.
  - B. Keep sensitive and available to God.
    - 1. Fellowship with the Lord. (Acts 4:13)
    - 2. Have a Jesus mindset, which is a godly life. (Hebrews 12:14)
  - C. Pay the price.
    - 1. One of the great weapons is prayer.
    - 2. We should not waste people's time by not preparing.
  - D. Develop a program with clear objectives.
  - E. Take a personal interest in people.
  - F. Develop measurable goals for people you are investing in.
