B. Your gloom will shine as noon day. (John 1:5; 1 John 4:4; John 3:19-20; 1 John 1:7)

C. The Lord will guide you continually.

D. God will satisfy your desires with good things. God knows what is best for us. (Ephesians 1:8; Psalm 106:14-15)

E. You will be like a watered garden. (John 7:38; Isaiah 32:2)

F. You will be like a shadow for those who are parched.

G. Your ancient ruins will be rebuilt: your failures, your dreams not coming true. (Job 2:25)

H. You will raise up the foundations of many generations.

I. You shall be called a repairer of the breaches such as freedom.(Isaiah 43:19; Leviticus 26:13)
